Computer Based Exam: The Final Countdown

November 2006 marks the beginning of the long awaited computer based exam delivery! The BOC will continue to deliver the Practical exam at designated BOC exam sites throughout the US. The exam schedule has changed to include "testing windows." Testing windows are two week periods of time in which a candidate may schedule to take the Written and/or Written Simulation portion(s) of their exam. For example, November 4 through the 17, candidates will be taking these two sections at ACT Testing Centers across the country. ACT has more than 200 centers across the US and Canada. Candidates will only be allowed to take the exam one time during each two week testing window. Candidates needing to take the Practical exam will do so on the FINAL Sunday of an exam window (i.e. November 19, 2006). The last time



the BOC exam will be administered in "sections" will be April 2007. After the April 2007 administration, the exam will no longer be administered in "sections." June 2007 will be the first completely computerized exam. The exam will be administered at ACT Testing Centers during two week testing windows. Candidates who need to retake ANY section of the BOC exam after the April 2007 exam date will retake the single "integrated" four hour computer exam. All the most current information regarding the exam redesign can be found on the BOC website by clicking on the red BOC Online tab on the front page, then Exam Redesign in the left column. Under Exam Redesign you will find sample questions for the new computer based format, scheduling and registration procedures and web presentations to guide you through the transition process.

Becoming Certified

The excitement is growing as our switch to a computer based exam becomes closer to reality. When we are fully transitioned in June 2007, candidates will have an improved exam experience with less travel, an exam schedule that fits their own schedule and a familiar interface. Those who rely on credential holders will have a defensible, high-quality exam that uses technology to ensure that BOC Certified Athletic Trainers are competent practitioners.

Here is the process:

1. Beginning in November and continuing with the February and April 2007 exam administrations, candidates will take the existing Written and Simulation exams using a computer instead of paper
 - Candidates will schedule to take the exams at their convenience during the two-week testing window before the Sunday Practical exam dates
 - Candidates will take the Written and Simulation exams at one of the ACT Testing Centers throughout the US
2. The Practical exam will be given on November 19, January 28 and April 22 at sites across the country
 - Exam scores will be made known within 2-4 weeks of scoring the Practical exam
3. In June 2007, we will transition to one, computer delivered, comprehensive exam that encompasses the skills and abilities previously tested on the Written, Simulation and Practical exams
 - Candidates will schedule the exam during one of five testing windows throughout the year
 - A testing window will typically be two weeks
 - The result will be made known within 2-4 weeks of the close of the testing window

Remaining Certified

The Standards of Professional Practice (Standards), consisting of the Practice Standards and the Code of Professional Responsibility, identify the requirements and essential practice expectations for all Athletic Trainers. The Standards are different than the NATA's Code of Ethics. Maintaining BOC certification as an Athletic Trainer is contingent upon adhering to the Standards.

Revised in January 2006, this document identifies what governs acceptable and appropriate behavior as an Athletic Trainer. The Standards serve as the foundation for judgment of behavior when complaints about an Athletic Trainer are made to our Professional Practice and Discipline Committee.

Please take a moment to review the Standards on our website. As our numbers increase at more than 30,000 BOC Certified Athletic Trainers, so does the possibility that someone will not comply with the Standards. We have a responsibility, identified in the Standards under Code 1: Patient Responsibility, to take action when we know others are engaged in illegal or unethical practice. This includes reporting those who practice athletic training without required state credentials.

Continuing education units (CEUs) are also required to remain certified! If you are like me in the Last Name A-G category, get your 25 CEUs submitted by using the handy ATC Online™ feature.

As always, thank you to our many volunteers and excellent BOC staff who make becoming certified and remaining certified possible.

2006 Certification Fee

Every ATC® credential holder is required to pay an annual certification fee, which supports the post-certification activities required of the BOC. The BOC annual certification fee is an administrative fee, much like licensing fees, that has been assessed since 1993. Invoices for the 2006 certification year were mailed to your most current address on record.

Fee payments are collected by one of the following methods:

If you are a member of the NATA, your BOC status is listed as “Active,” and your membership dues are current as of September 30 of this year:

Customer Survey Results

In April 2006, the BOC posted a survey on our website to gather information regarding customer satisfaction. In June, we sent it out as an attachment to 7,000 random emails, and, at the national convention, we put it in every registration packet. 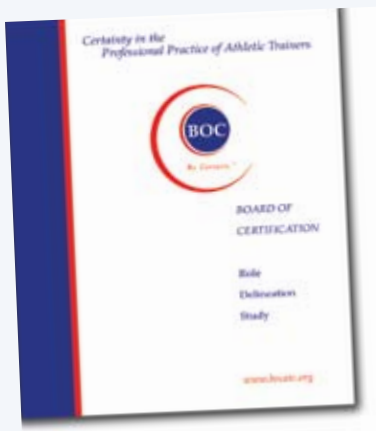

Also, keep in mind that you need to be current with the Emergency Cardiac Care requirements throughout the reporting period. Your current certification must cover the following:

- Adult and Pediatric CPR
- AED
- 2nd Rescuer CPR
- Airway Obstruction
- Barrier Devices



The two most common courses that meet these requirements are:

- CPR/AED for the Professional Rescuer from the American Red Cross
- BLS Healthcare Provider CPR from the American Heart Association

* *Please note that other courses offered by the American Red Cross and the American Heart Association may not meet all of the above requirements.*

New Procedure for BOC Approved Providers

Athletic Trainers have always been responsible for reporting continuing education (CE) truthfully. In cooperation with BOC Approved Providers, the BOC has created an avenue for Athletic Trainers to report CE hours in which they actually participated. Effective January 1, 2007, a new procedure will be encouraged to empower you, as a Certified Athletic Trainer, with the responsibility to claim only those hours in which you actually participate in an event. All BOC Approved Providers will be encouraged to provide certificates of attendance at the conclusion of an event. The following statement should be present on each certificate in order for CE to be valid. It is the responsibility of the Athletic Trainer to enter the actual number of hours participated.



Name of Company is recognized by the Board of Certification, Inc. to offer continuing education (CE) for Certified Athletic Trainers. This program has been approved for a maximum of (#) hours of Category A CE. Certified Athletic Trainers are responsible for claiming only those hours actually spent participating in the CE activity.

Certificates of completion should be awarded to athletic training participants at the conclusion of the event. If an Athletic Trainer must leave an event early the certificate of attendance can be given upon departure and the actual number of hours participated are entered on the certificate. Again, it is the responsibility of the Athletic Trainer to enter the actual number of hours participated. *Be Certain™* to check the certificate of attendance for the above statement. CE will not be valid without this statement on the certificate of attendance.

2003-2005 Continuing Education Audit

The Board of Certification Inc. (BOC) is wrapping up its Continuing Education (CE) audit for the 2003 - 2005 reporting period. The BOC has reviewed documentation for 4,213 CE files since April 1, 2006, and 1,215 (29%) were found to have deficiencies. Some of the more frequent deficient areas included:

Emergency Cardiac Care (most common)

As noted in the 2006-2011 Continuing Education Guidelines, Emergency Cardiac Care must include:

- Adult and Pediatric CPR – both one-person and two-person
- AED
- Barrier Devices
- Airway Obstruction
- The two most common courses* that meet these requirements are:
 - * CPR/AED for the Professional Rescuer from the American Red Cross
 - * BLS for Healthcare Providers CPR from the American Heart Association

* Please note that other courses offered by the American Red Cross and American Heart Association may not meet the above requirements.

Credit for Speaking Engagements

In order to receive credit for a conference presentation or training program, the audience must include Athletic Trainers or other healthcare professionals. Credit can only be given once per topic.

Lack of Documentation

Be Certain™ to obtain a certificate or letter of completion for all CE activities and retain them in a safe and secure place. Program booklets and receipts are not sufficient documentation of attendance.

Dates Not Matching

Be Certain™ to enter the completion date correctly. Completion dates for home study courses and online programs will be the date on the certificate or letter of completion.

Photocopies of Documents

The BOC will only accept original or notarized photocopies of documentation in order to comply with the audit.

Duplicate Entries

Be Certain™ to review your online entries before you complete your final submission.
